Local Organizations & Providers

BAGLY (Boston Alliance of Gay, Lesbian, and Transgender Youth): Creates safe spaces for LGBTQ+ youth through social, educational, and health-related programs and services

<u>Fenway Health</u>: Provides comprehensive health care services, including mental health care, to the LGBTQ+ youth at its Sidney Borum, Jr. Health Center in Boston

GLASS (GLBTQ+ Adolescent Social Services): Provides medical care, mental health counseling, and case management to LGBTQ+ youth in the Greater Boston and Greater Framingham areas

Greater Boston PFLAG (Parents, Families, and Friends of Lesbians and Gays): Offers community and one-to-one support for parents, caregivers, and families of LGBTQ+ people. PFLAG is a community partner of Samaritans.

<u>Out MetroWest</u>: Provides free programs that connect LGBTQ+ youth with peers and LGBTQ+ adult role models

<u>The Theater Offensive</u>: Arts organization that explore LGBTQ+ issues and experiences. Their True Colors: OUT Youth Theater program is for ages 13–25.

National Organizations

<u>Born This Way Foundation</u>: Supports LGBTQ+ youth mental wellness through education and programs and connects young people with resources and support

GLSEN (Gay, Lesbian, and Straight Education Network): Education organization working to end discrimination, harassment, and bullying based on sexual and gender identity

<u>The Network/La Red</u>: Survivor-led social justice organization that works to end domestic violence in LGBTQ+ communities
